Re: Fire Protection Financial Assistance Grant, Project #FES-SA0035

I am pleased to confirm that Fire and Emergency Services – Newfoundland and Labrador (FES – NL), Department of Municipal Affairs, has approved a Fire Protection Financial Assistance Grant in the amount of \$6,957.50 on a 70/30 Provincial/Municipal cost-shared basis to purchase 10 Pagers for the Happy Valley – Goose Bay Fire Department. The following table outlines the cost-sharing details:

Total funding	\$6,957.50
Total funding less GST & partial HST rebate	\$6,503.75
Provincial / Municipal cost sharing ratio	70/30
Provincial share less GST & partial HST rebate	\$4,552.63
Municipal share less GST & partial HST rebate	\$1,951.13

With the reduction of the GST and partial HST rebate, which you are required to utilize as part of this purchase, the maximum provincial share provided towards this purchase will be \$4,552.63. Your town council must make arrangements to apply to Revenue Canada for the GST and partial HST rebate as soon as they are eligible. In the event that this project is completed below the estimated amount, the savings will not be available to your town council to be used otherwise.

The provincial share of this grant will be issued upon submission of invoice(s) to the FES – NL office no later than December 30, 2016, at the following address:

If invoice(s) are not received by the FES – NL office by the December 30, 2016 deadline, funding approval will be withdrawn and reallocated. The FES – NL staff will review the invoice(s) to ensure that costs are eligible and consistent with the purpose of the funding prior to the issuance of the cheque to your municipality. Please note that the Happy Valley – Goose Bay Town Council is responsible for all costs exceeding the approved funding.

In addition, FES – NL encourages local governments to review the results of their fire department assessments, with a view to ensuring fire departments can meet their full potential. Firefighters should have or obtain the necessary training to utilize their firefighting equipment. If you require any assistance or information on improving the delivery of fire protection services please contact my staff at FES – NL.

It is also anticipated that municipal sector events (e.g., regional MNL meetings) throughout the year will be used to further engage and continue dialogue on these key municipal areas in order to identify workable solutions.


I want to formally thank you and your crew for the efforts that you have made in reducing (practically eliminating!) motorized traffic on the riverbank behind our home on Hamilton River Road.

As you are aware, my husband, John Martin, and I met with you in the Spring of 2015 and appealed to you to post signs at all entrances to the riverbank. Two signs had been in place, but we felt that two more in the lower end of town were necessary to stop the ceaseless flow of speeding traffic behind our house. The fact that we now had three young grandchildren who often played in our backyard made our request an urgent safety concern.

For years, we had been asking municipal representatives for action to be taken, and nothing was done. At this time, I want to formally and sincerely thank you for hearing our concerns, and for taking the requested action last spring. It has made all the difference!

The Spring, Summer, and Fall of 2015 saw a drastic reduction (maybe 60-70% fewer dirt bikes and side-by-sides), and this year, the numbers have fallen even more, to the point that maybe only a dozen or so vehicles have ventured through. We must also acknowledge the efforts of the town constable who stopped motorists on several occasions in the summer of 2015, thus helping to spread the word, but the signage continues to act as a necessary deterrent.

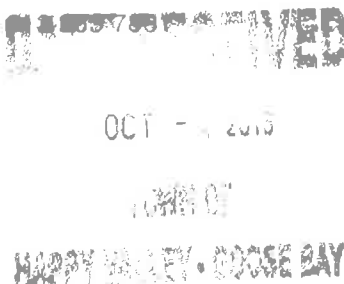

Re: Another Opportunity to Have Your Say in Canada Post Review

I am following up on our June 6th correspondence about the Canada Post Review to provide you with additional information on phase 2 of the review.

This fall, a parliamentary committee will be consulting with Canadians on postal service and the options identified by a task force in phase 1. The committee will make recommendations to the government by year's end. The government expects to announce its decisions about Canada Post in the spring of 2017.

You may be interested to know that the options identified by the task force include major changes to the moratorium on post office closures in rural and small towns. The task force suggests "updating" or "refreshing" the moratorium. It outlines the cost savings that could be achieved by converting to franchises or closing all corporate outlets, or only the 800 highest yielding offices. CUPW would like to ensure that the views of municipalities are considered during each stage of the Canada Post Review. Therefore, we are urging you to fill out the parliamentary committee's online survey from September 26 to October 21 at parl.gc.ca/OGGO-e and encourage residents to do likewise. During this time, paper surveys will be available upon request. The committee will also hold public consultations across the country.

Public review on future of Canada Post

Whereas Canada Post announced drastic cutbacks to our public postal service in December 2013, including plans to end home mail delivery in our country.

Whereas there was a huge public outcry in response to the cutbacks and stiff opposition from most federal parties, including the Liberal Party, which promised to halt the delivery cuts and conduct a review of Canada Post, if elected.

Whereas the delivery cuts were halted and our Liberal government is currently conducting a Canada Post Review, which started earlier this year with an independent task force to identify options for the future of postal service in this country.

Whereas a parliamentary committee will hold e-consultations and meetings in various locations across the country on postal service and the options that have been identified by the task force and then make recommendations to the government on the future of Canada Post.

Whereas it will be crucial for the parliamentary committee to hear our views on key issues, including the importance of maintaining the moratorium on post office closures, improving the Canadian Postal Service Charter, adding postal banking, greening Canada Post, keeping decent post office jobs in our communities, preserving daily delivery, restoring home mail delivery, developing services that help older Canadians remain in their homes and providing services that assist people with disabilities,
